Spotlight on This Month's Special Guests . . .



Maucha Adnet was born in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, and started her professional singing career at the age of 15. From 1984 to 1994, Maucha performed, toured and recorded with legendary composer Antonio Carlos Jobim and his band Banda Nova. The recordings included four

CDs, 'Passarim', 'Antonio Brasileiro' Grammy Winner, 'Tom Jobim Inédito' and 'Rio Revisited' Antonio Carlos Jobim and Gal Costa . Maucha toured with Jobim throughout Brazil, United States, Japan, Israel and Europe. Maucha has also recorded with such artists as Dorival Caymmi, Chico Buarque, Dori Caymmi, Caetano Veloso, Toninho Horta, Joyce, and many others. She was the guest vocalist on Randy Brecker's Grammy Winner CD 'Into the Sun'. Residing in New York for many years, Maucha has been performing regularly with her own band as well as Claudio Roditi, Herbie Mann, Trio da Paz, Oscar Castro Neves, Eliane Elias, Mark Johnson, Slide Hampton, Randy Brecker, Carnegie Hall Jazz Band at various venues, notably; Carnegie Hall, Avery Fisher Hall, Blue Note and Birdland.

Born in Rio de Janeiro, **Duduka de Fonseca** began playing the drums at the age of twelve. By fifteen, he was appearing on television, performing with the top musicians in Brazil. In 1975 Duduka moved to New York where he established numerous Brazilian jazz groups. The Brazilian Jazz All Stars featured artists Bob Mintzer, Eliane Elias and Randy Brecker. Duduka has performed and recorded with such artists as Antonio Carlos Jobim, Astrud Gilberto, Herbie Mann, Claudio Roditi, Joanne Brackeen, Eddie Gomez, John Scofield, Joe Henderson, Gerry Mulligan, Wayne Shorter and many others. Since 1984, he has been a member of the faculty at the Drummer's Collective where he conducts workshops and gives private lessons. Duduka has also conducted workshops in Europe and Japan. He is the author of an instructional book and tape set entitled *Brazilian Rhythms for Drumset*, published by Manhattan Music/DCI.



Gene Lees writes, "Stan Getz was once asked his idea of the perfect tenor saxophone soloist. His answer was, 'My technique, Al Cohn's ideas, and Zoot's time.' The fulfillment of that ideal may well be embodied in thirty-year-old Harry Allen." BMG recording artist **Harry Allen** has over twenty recordings to his name. Three of Harry's CDs have won Gold Disc Awards from Japan's Swing Journal Magazine, and his CD Tenors Anyone? won both the Gold Disc Award and the New Star Award. His recordings have made the top ten list for favorite new releases in Swing Journal Magazine's and Jazz Journal International's critic's poll.

Roseanna Vitro brings a wealth of swing, melodic improvisation and heartfelt expression to the jazz idiom. She combines a vibrant energy and spirit, a deep understanding of the history and theoretical elements of jazz with her rhythmic, soulful southern roots to produce her own unique sound and style. Her many CDs have featured Elvin Jones, "Fat Head" Newman, George Coleman, Al Foster, Kenny Barron, Kenny Werner, Gary Bartz and Fred Hersch.
